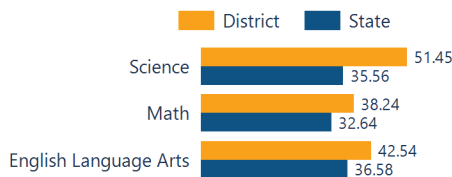

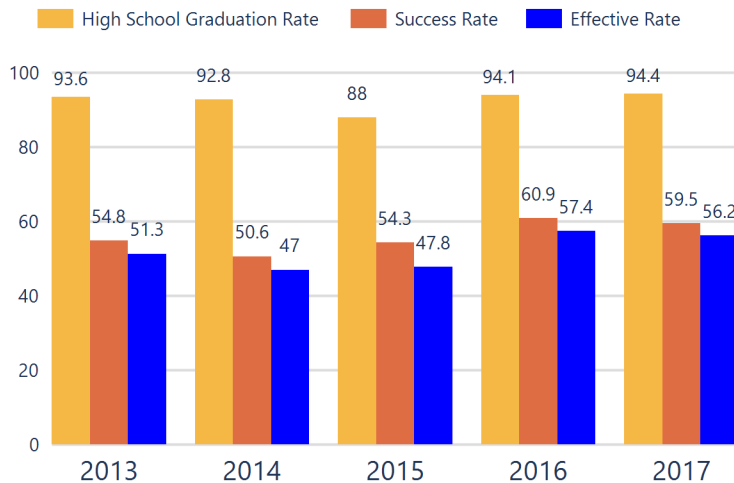

Graduation Rate: The 4-year
adjusted cohort graduation rate is the
number of students who graduate in
four years with a regular high school
diploma divided by the number of
students who entered high school as
9th graders four years earlier (adjusting
for transfers in and out).

Success Rate: A student must meet
one of the four following outcomes
within two years of High School
graduation.

1. Student earned an Industry
Recognized Certification while in
High School.
2. Student earned a
Postsecondary Certificate.
3. Student earned a Postsecondary
Degree.
4. Student enrolled in Postsecondary
in both the first and second year
following High School graduation.

Effective Rate: The calculated
Graduation Rate multiplied by the
calculated Success Rate.

GRADUATION RATE

The four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate is the percentage of students in a cohort, adjusted for transfers into and out of the school, district, or state, who graduate with a regular high school diploma within four years of entering high school.

ATTENDANCE RATE

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences.

CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM

Percentage of students who miss 10% or more of school days per year either with or without a valid excuse.

DROPOUT RATE

The dropout rate is calculated annually and reflects the number of seventh- twelfth grade students who drop out in any one school year. A dropout is any student who exits school between October 1 and September 30 with a dropout EXIT code AND does not re-enroll in school by September 30.

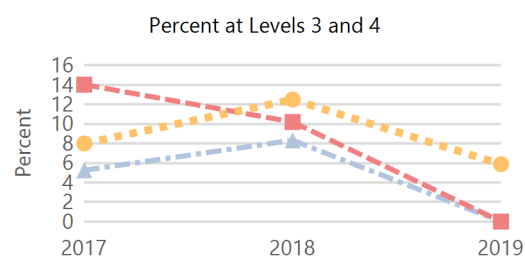
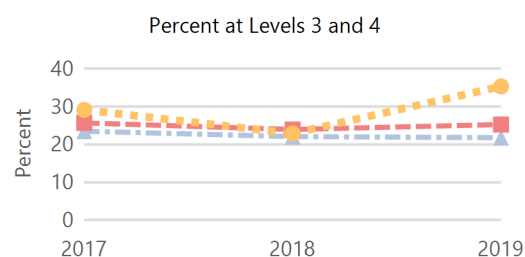
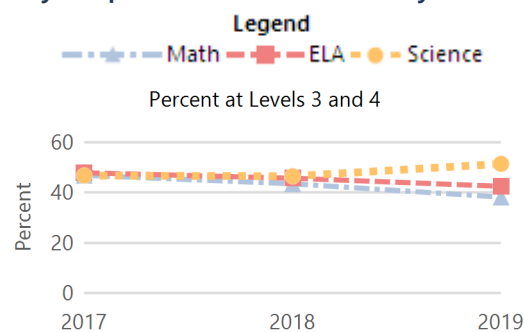
ACT Performance (2018 School Year)

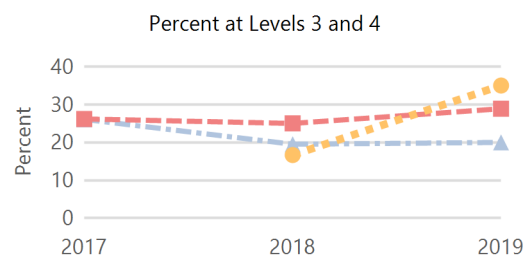
